COUNCIL MEETING MATTERS

At the April Council Meeting held in Bremer Bay, the following matters were considered:

Budget Review 2022/2023

Council conducted a Budget Review for the financial year 2022/2023 in accordance with the *Local Government* (Financial Management) Regulations 1996.

Proposed Overheight Dwelling

Council approved an application for alterations and additions to a building on Lot 8 Point Henry Road, subject to conditions.

Local Law Review

Council resolved to undertake a review of all of its Local Laws. There will be public notice and submissions will be invited through this process, which is expected to take 12 months to complete.

Strategic Community Plan

Council endorsed the minor review its Strategic Community Plan 2021-2031. This was a desktop review, as the Plan was only adopted in 2021. A formal review is due in 2024.

Policy Manual Review—Finance

Council's Finance Policies were reaffirmed, with a minor change to the Procurement of Goods and Services Policy to reflect current purchasing conditions.

Bushfire Mitigation Activities Tender RFT 01-23

The Bushfire Mitigation Activities Tender was awarded to Indiji Flora, for the period 27 April 2023—30 May 2024.

PUBLIC NOTICE HAZARD REDUCTION ACTIVITIES – BREMER BAY TOWNSITE

Residents and visitors of Bremer Bay are advised that volunteers and staff from Bremer Bay VFES, Jerramungup BFB's and Shire of Jerramungup will be conducting Hazard Reduction Burns in the Bremer Bay town site over the coming weeks.

PURPOSE: To commence with the establishment of a low fuel buffer zone around the Bremer Bay town site to

reduce the potential for a bushfire impacting the town site.

Prescribed burning will be undertaken with consideration of winds to minimise smoke from entering

town site.

DATE: Beginning Wednesday, 26 April 2023 (Autumn equinox) for a period of approximately 4-6 weeks.

LOCATION: Areas of the Bremer Bay town site and fire management access tracks as per the map below:

WHAT TO DO DURING AND AFTER HAZARD REDUCTION ACTIVITIES:

- Traffic speed restrictions of 40kph will apply with traffic management signs installed on day of the burns.
- Road closures may also be in place on the day of burning activities for the safety of Fire Fighters operating within the area.

CURRENT PUBLIC NOTICE CONTINUED

- Motorists are asked to have their headlights on when driving through the area and drive to the conditions as the smoke hazard may remain for a number of days after the burn is completed.
- Abide by all directions of Fire Fighters/Emergency Services personnel on scene.
- Smoke may affect visibility and air quality in and around Bremer Bay on the day itself and the days following. Residents and visitors with any respiratory conditions are reminded to have their medication close by or on them as a precaution.
- Fire Fighters will be conducting patrols of the treatment areas in the days following each prescribed burn.

 - 2. Habitat restoration works of the Boxwood Hill gravel pit. Weed control activities along footpaths and road verges.
 - 3. Habitat improvement of known Carnaby's Black Cockatoo foraging zones within the Shire's road reserves. Weed control activities along footpaths and road verges.
 - 4. Habitat restoration of retired gravel pits along road reserves supporting Kwongan Vegetation Communities.
